Parents' views expressed in our annual questionnaire are important to us. Following feedback from our last questionnaire in 2019, we have listened and both schools shared learning by holding а workshop, for example. Our schools continue to work with other schools and federations as part of the Suffolk Learning and Improvement Network to support and review good practice. Opportunities have been available for our staff to visit other schools to explore approaches used and share our own practice too. Our Federation continues to be strong and classes are working on building Thank you to all parents who completed opportunities to work together within the their questionnaires. It is a really useful curriculum. Our successes from last year include shared events like the recycling exhibition and locality projects. These have been positively received by parents and well attended.
